



Year 5's Home Learning Letter



<p>Spelling</p>	<p>Rule: Prefixes and Year 5 words <i>When the prefix -dis, -mis or -re is added to a word, it gives that word the opposite meaning.</i></p> <p>Sentence: Lightning can reoccur more than once during a thunder storm, which creates marvellous displays. Practise your spelling sentence and the other year 5 words on Spelling Shed.</p>	
<p>Reading</p>	<p>Quick Quiz! Have a go at answering these questions using the dragon text.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Dragons can discern sounds well outside the human range... What does the word discern mean in this sentence? What happens to people who gaze into the eyes of a dragon? Using information from the text, work out whether these statements are true or false. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dragons can only see in black and white. It is not a good idea to look into the eyes of a dragon. Their hearing and sense of smell are as good as their eyesight. Dragons have a sixth sense. 	
<p>Writing: Writing Challenges</p>	<p>Writing Challenges! Using what you have learnt so far, choose one of the following three challenges to complete:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Imagine that a Mythical Beasts Directory is being created. Write an entry for a mythical beast of your choice (or your own creation) in the style of the Dino Directory. Using the information from the Dino Directory, create a top three 'most deadly dinosaurs' page, justifying the reasons for your ranking with evidence from the website and other sources. Imagine that you have travelled in time and encountered one of these incredible creatures! Write an account of your meeting with a dinosaur. This could be expanded into a full story. 	
<p>Handwriting</p>	 	<p>Write each letter out 3 times quickly to practise your fluency and then 3 times carefully to practise your letter formation. Then, write five words which start with these letters. Don't forget to draw your trees!</p>
<p>Maths: Geometry</p>	<p>Step One: Work out the missing angles! Remember, all the angles on a line add up to 180° You need to add up all the angles on the line that you know, and then subtract your answer from 180°</p>  <p>Step Two: Flora is describing angles on a straight line for her friend to draw. She says that one of the angles is 32°, another is a right angle and the final angle is 68°. Is Flora correct? Prove it!</p>	

Step Three: Can you work out the missing angles in this picture?
Remember, angles in a triangle equal 180°




Wider Curriculum
