


Year R's Home Learning Letter

Reading	<p>Read for 5-10 minutes with an adult. Find your favourite book in your house, snuggle up and read it with a grown-up (perhaps with a hot chocolate and biscuit?). Talk to your grown up about why it is your favourite book.</p>													
Writing	<p>Write a sentence about what you like about your favourite book.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Don't forget to snuggle your letters into words, leaving gaps between them. Use the sound and word mats in your learning pack. 													
Handwriting	<p>See information in pack for more guidance.</p> <p>Practise m and p from the jumper family. Challenge: write five words which use the letters.</p>													
Maths	<p>Size sorting – This activity can be adapted to use a variety of resources, for example shells, buttons or bears. Give the children a group of different sized objects and three sorting bowls. Ask them to sort the objects into small, medium and large using the bowls. The children will need to compare and contrast the items against one another in order to sort them into the correct bowl.</p>

History/ ICT	<p>Technology over time Talk to someone older than you (you could telephone a Grandparent-they would love to hear from you!) and ask them what technology was like when they were young. Ask them about telephones, televisions and computers- you will be amazed about how things have changed!</p>
