Writing:





1. Find out some information about Winston Churchill and present it.
2. Write a letter to him as if you were living 75 years ago and just heard his radio broadcast.
3. Write a letter to him as you now explaining how the world has changed 75 years later.

Handwriting:

Maths: Let's use our multiplication knowledge in some word problems today:

Step 1: Can you show these calculations as a bar model and an array today?

2×4

3×5

9×10

4×5

7×10

Step 2: How many crayons are there in total if each box holds 10 crayons?

What would the answer be if there were twice as many boxes?



Step 3: Tubes of bubbles come in packs of 2 and 5. Lily has 22 tubes of bubbles. How many of each pack could she have? How many ways can you do it?
