

Year 6's Home Learning Letter





<p>Spelling</p>	<p>Rule: Words ending '-ant', '-ance' or '-ancy'.</p> <p>Spelling sentence: VE Day was a significant event where acceptance of peace occurred across Europe. The brilliantly and endurance of everyone who fought for our country was celebrated.</p> <p>Practise this week's spelling sentence. Try to use a range of different techniques over the week.</p>
<p>Reading and Writing</p>	<p>Spend at least 30 minutes reading a book today.</p> <p>Writing Challenges:</p> <p>Using what you have learnt so far, choose one of the following three challenges to complete:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Who would live in a place like this? Write a character description of the owner of the house and include details about their occupation, hobbies and family. 2) Imagine that the house and its grounds are to be sold. Using evidence from the prologue, write an estate agent's advert for the house. Think about the purpose, audience and form of the advert and how you will need to adapt your language choices. 3) Write the opening to the first chapter of the novel. How will the story develop from this spooky prologue? Who will the characters be?
<p>Handwriting</p>	<p>Today, let's look at I and L.</p> <p>Remember, three by the tree, then three in a row for flow. Then, write 5 words and 5 sentences that begin with each letter.</p> <p>Don't forget to snuggle your letters and draw your trees in the margin! You need to work on your strength too so you could complete some of your jobs in lizard or try to hold your body weight up in gorilla.</p>
<p>Arithmetic</p>	<p>Here are the answers to the arithmetic questions. (M) means I would have a go mentally first and (W) means I would go straight for a written method.</p> <p>867 + 300 = 1167 (M) 1616 ÷ 8 = 202 (W) $\frac{1}{8}$ of 32 = 4 (M) 67 x 8 = 536 (W) 6.54 x 10 = 65.4 (M)</p> <p>Have a look at these arithmetic questions. Think carefully about whether you solve it mentally rather than going straight to a written method.</p> <p>$\frac{1}{3}$ of 84 = 7684 ÷ 8 = 8.761 x 10 = 206 x 8 = 600 + 573 =</p>
