<p>English Reading</p>	<p>This week, I'd like to try something a little different. Each day for your English reading session, I will be sending you a link to a chapter of an audio book. Listen to the book then answer the question below. The title of the audio book is called 'Tom's Midnight Garden'. <p>English Writing</p>		<p>I have had a few of you request that I ask you to plan and write another story as this is quite fun to do at home. So I'd like you to write a story based upon the audio book that you are listening to in your reading.</p> <p>The first thing you will need is a main character. Think about the characters in part one of our story. Write a short character description for Tom. What does he look like? What type of personality does he have? What emotions does he show in this chapter?</p> <p>Now that you have an idea of the type of character you need for your story, create one of your own. Your main character (which could be a boy or girl) will be representing the part of Tom in your story.</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>This week, I will be asking you to remember the lessons that we have had on fractions. Let's start with a little quiz (the answers are on the bottom of this letter:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. What is the top number called on a fraction?</li> <li>2. What is the bottom number called on a fraction?</li> <li>3. What is an equivalent fraction?</li> <li>4. Name 5 different common fractions that you have been taught so far.</li> <li>5. Put these in order: <math>\frac{1}{3}</math> <math>\frac{1}{2}</math> <math>\frac{1}{4}</math></li> </ol> <p><b>Today's challenge:</b> How many ways can you represent a quarter (<math>\frac{1}{4}</math>)? Think about equivalent fractions, multiplying or dividing whole numbers (<math>\frac{1}{4}</math> of 12 = 3), drawing Dienes, representing the fraction on a clock, drawing a diagram. There are many ways to do this. Could you make an A4 poster all about <math>\frac{1}{4}</math>?</p> <p><b>Remember:</b> Your fraction is your whole number split into four <b>equal parts</b>. A quarter is representing one out of the four <b>equal parts</b> of the whole.</p>	

**Maths quiz answers:** 1. Numerator 2. Denominator 3. Fractions with different numbers representing the same part of a whole eg,  $\frac{1}{2}$  and  $\frac{2}{4}$  are the same. 4. Your answers could include  $\frac{1}{8}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{2}{3}$ ,  $\frac{3}{4}$ ,  $\frac{5}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$
