


Year R's Home Learning Letter (Wednesday) 13.5.20

Activities this week are based around the story 'The Hungry Caterpillar'. Don't worry if you don't have a copy at home. I have it and will read it and put on tapestry.

Phonics	<p>Two syllable words Say a word e.g. <i>desktop</i>, clap each syllable and ask your child to do the same. Repeat with two or three more words. Clap the first word again and tell the children that the first clap is on <i>desk</i> and the second is on <i>top</i>. Read out two syllable words children clap out the syllables segment them and write them if possible: <i>lunchbox, helpdesk, windmill, treetop, starlight, desktop, sandwich, sandpit</i>. Writing	<p>Create a story map for the story of the Very Hungry Caterpillar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't forget to snuggle your letters into words, leaving gaps between them. • Use the sound and word mats in your learning pack. 		
Handwriting	<p>Practise this</p> <div style="display: flex; align-items: center;"> <div style="margin-left: 20px;"> <p>letter:</p> </div> </div> <p>See information in pack for more guidance. Challenge: write the words – ink, it, tip, pip</p>
