Remember: Your sentence is always on Spelling Shed so you can play some games too if you want to.


Reading:

- 1) The film is called '...a story without words...' Write the missing story to go with the film, using descriptive language, conjunctions and maintaining the past tense.
- 2) Write a letter from the fox to the girl thanking her for looking after him and retelling all the amazing sites they saw together.
- 3) Write a blurb for the video, similar to that found on the back of a story book. What is the story about? Who are the main characters and who would you recommend the story to?

Maths:



Here are some maths problems for you today. Use your work on arrays and bar models to help.

Step 1: Pencils come in packs of 25. We need to put 5 in a pot. How many pots do we need?

Step 2: Stickers come in sheets of 6. I have five sheets. If I share the stickers between three people, how many stickers do we have each?

Step 3: You have 30 counters. How many different ways can you put them into equal groups?
