



Make a note of any words that you can't spell correctly then practise writing them in your books.</p>

Look at the picture above and write down as many expanded noun phrases as you can for that picture. Remember, <b>Adjective Comma Adjective Noun</b>.</li> <li>2. Use those <b>expanded noun phrases</b> to make sentences that include a <b>fronted adverbial</b> and a <b>prepositional phrase</b>. Here is my example: <b>Because they were in body casts, the brothers could not reach the ruby, red diamond, which was balanced on the table between them.</b></li> </ol>		
<p>Maths</p>	<p><b>Joins</b></p> <p>Join any four numbers. Find their total. Joins can go up, down or sideways, but not diagonally. The score shown is <math>8 + 15 + 6 + 18 = 47</math>.</p>  <p>Find the highest possible score. Find the lowest possible score.</p> <p>Try joining five numbers.
