
Writing:


Maths:

Step 1: How many ways can you represent the number 35? Remember you can draw it, write a calculation, draw dienes, use lego.

Step 2: Which of these calculations does not have the answer 35? Explain how you know.

$$25 + 20 = 35 \quad 25 + 5 = 35 \quad 25 + 10 = 35$$

Step 3: What numbers are represented below? Can you write it in numerals and words? Challenge: Show the same number in a different way.
