Spelling:

This week's spelling sentence is:

Why are you **worrying** that you **copied** the **drawing**?

What is the difference between adding '-ing' and '-ed' to words that end with a 'y'? Play with the endings on the words 'worry' and 'copy' that are in your spelling sentence. Try it with **dry, cry, deny, apply, empty**.

Challenge: Can you find any more words that work like this?

Remember: Your sentence is always on Spelling Shed so you can enjoy playing some games too if you want to.

Reading:

I would like you to participate in a reading activity every day for 15 minutes either on your own or with an adult. Don't forget you can head over to www.oxfordowl.co.uk or sign in to BugClub for more books.

Writing:

You can add this onto your piece of paper or put it on a new one. Make sure your name is nice and clear! Tomorrow: All will become clear with what you are going to do with them!


Handwriting:

Maths:

Step 1: Anna buys a red apple and a green apple. How much does she spend? Can you show me these as coins?




Step 2: Anna buys a red apple, a green apple and a bannana. What is her change from 98p?

Remember to use your number line work to help you and you can draw dienes if this helps.

Step 3: What if Anna had 70p in her purse?

Challenge: How many combinations can you create of items she could buy for 98p?

Remember: You can log onto Maths Shed and play some games that help practise your 2s,5s,10s and 3s.



Wider curriculum:

Art: Today your colour is **PURPLE**. How many items can you find in your home that are the colour purple? If you want, you could use this colour on your daily exercise and see how many items you can find in nature.

Geography: Find out about places of interest in the UK that you might want to visit one day. Here are some suggestions: The Severn Bridge, The Angel of the North, The Falkirk Wheel, Big Ben, The Roman Baths. Create a poster sharing the facts and whereabouts they are located. **Challenge:** If you want to, you could create a map of the UK and plot these 5 places on.
