





Year 4's Home Learning Letter -

Make a note of any words that you can't spell correctly then practise writing them in your books. Colour in each syllable in a different colour.</p>  <p style="text-align: center;">Elephant</p> <p>Try this for words with unstressed vowels.</p> </div>
<p>English Reading</p>	<p>Spend 20 minutes reading your library book. Talk to your grown-ups about who your favourite character is and why.</p>	
<p>English Writing</p>	 	<p>Have a look at these two book covers. These are the first two stories in a trilogy of 'Misfitz Mystery' books. What is the same about these two covers? What is different? You might find that writing your thoughts in a Venn diagram might be helpful.</p> <p>If you'd like an extra task: without cheating and looking on Google, design the front cover for the final book in the trilogy.
