Discussion of the Week

With the end of the second lockdown on the horizon next week, and only 3 weeks to go until the end of term, we would like to thank you for all of your support with encouraging your children to follow the rules in school enabling us to remain focused on the health and safety of everyone here. As the temperature has dropped again, from next week, classrooms will be ventilated by windows and internal doors only. All corridors and communal spaces will remain ventilated by external doors. We have also had some work done on adjusting the heating so that inside school is warmer than it usually is. If you would like your child to keep wearing additional layers, that is fine with us. Please do ensure that your child is sticking to our uniform policy – it is expected that children wear smart, uniformed colours with school shoes to school. If there are specific reasons why this cannot be, even only for a short time, please do talk to us about this.

Parents Evening - Thank you to those of you who have already used the booking system to secure your online meeting for next Tuesday and Wednesday after school. You should have received a guide to how to log on and access the meeting. Please let us know if you need any additional information. Teachers are looking forward to sharing their feedback about how the children have settled in to their new classes since September and how well they are achieving.

Crossing Patrols - I have been asked to share some reminders about safe use of the crossing patrols. The patrols are there to help everyone over the road safely, they are not able to look after children at the side of the road until parents catch up to them. Children must stay close to their parent/carer at the crossing point until the ladies ask them to cross. I attach also a leaflet, particularly for the new families in Year R for further information.

Hampshire Constabulary – The Police have been in touch with further information regarding continued reports of attempts being made by a driver in a silver car asking children before and after school to get into his car. Please be reassured that we have some activities and discussion opportunities that we do with children in school to help to support their confidence in dealing with any situation that may arise in their life such as this. This work has been refreshed with Y5/6 children who are most likely to be walking to and from school on their own. It is advised that at present, children walk to and from school with others.
